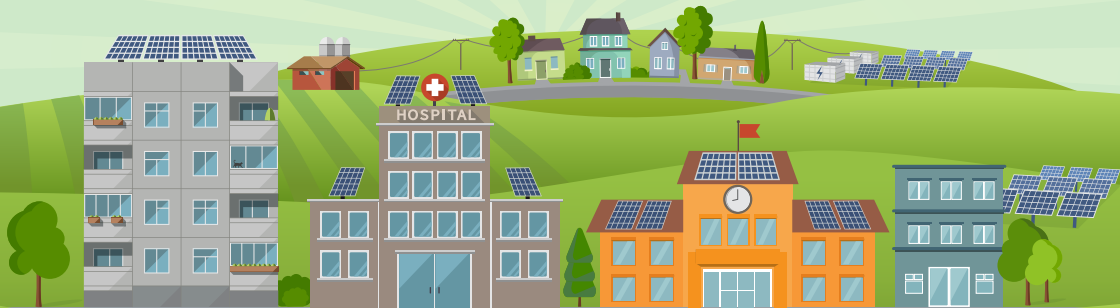


NATIONAL COMMUNITY SOLAR PARTNERSHIP



Led by the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE's) Solar Energy Technologies Office, the National Community Solar Partnership (NCSP), seeks to expand access to affordable community solar to every American household by 2025.

The National Community Solar Partnership is a coalition of stakeholders, including representatives from state, local, and tribal governments, utilities, businesses, financial institutions, and housing providers, working together to expand access to affordable community solar to every American household by 2025.

The partnership works to address key market barriers; DOE provides technical assistance and hosts an online community tool to support easy information exchange.

GOALS OF THE PARTNERSHIP

- Make community solar accessible to every U.S. household by 2025.
- Ensure community solar is affordable for every U.S. household.
- Enable communities to realize supplementary benefits and other value streams from community solar installations.

KEY AREAS OF COLLABORATION

- **Inclusive community solar models** that enable market adoption in underserved communities
- Community solar models that reduce energy bills for **multifamily affordable housing** dwellers and owners
- **Utility partnerships** around community solar models to expand solar access in their communities
